

VILLAGE OF GLASFORD
BOARD MEETING MINUTES – JUNE 18, 2020

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Village Board of Glasford was convened at 7:00pm. In attendance were Mayor Rudd, Clerk Stetler, Trustees Allen, Pilgrim, Whaley, and Sheckler. Trustess Kingsley and Randle were absent. Also in attendance were Streets/Maintenance Supt. Reimer, Chief Beachler, Brian Knott and Bob Zessin.

Motion to approve May 21, 2020 board meeting minutes made by Pilgrim, 2nd by Allen. Roll call: ALLEN-AYE; PILGRIM-AYE; WHALEY-AYE; SHECKLER-AYE. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion to approve Ord. 2020-04 Prevailing Wage Ordinance made by Pilgrim, 2nd by Allen. Roll call: ALLEN-AYE; PILGRIM-AYE; WHALEY-AYE; SHECKLER-AYE. All ayes, motion carried.

Board formally denied Knott's building permit application. Mayor Rudd refused to sign the building permit application. Mr. Knott then requested a formal denial letter stating the reason for the denial of said application.


Trustee Whaley revisited the matter of Brian Knott's building permit request being denied. Discussion followed. Board feels that the metal shipping container is not consider a storage shed in accordance with the zoning ordinance.

Mayor Rudd requested that effective immediately that all building permits would have to be approved at monthly board meetings. The reason being is that all board members would then be aware of all permits being issued in the Village. Discussion followed. Board agreed that all building permits will come before the entire board for approval effective immediately.

Chief Beachler requested that the fee for the vehicle restoration permit be raised and the amount of time be shortened. Discussion followed. Fee will be increased to \$500 and permit would be good only for sixty (60) days. Matter will be voted on at July 16, 2020 board meeting.
