

VILLAGE OF GLASFORD
BOARD MEETING MINUTES – AUGUST 20, 2020

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Village Board of Glasford was convened at 7:00pm. In attendance were Mayor Rudd, Clerk Stetler, Trustees Randle, Pilgrim, Whaley, Sheckler and Kingsley. Trustee Allen was absent. Also in attendance were Streets/Maint. Supt. Reimer; Chief Beachler; Nanette Rudd; Michele Knott, Darell Tucker, Rick Shurts and Jason Cohee.

Motion to approve July 16, 2020 board meeting minutes made by Pilgrim, 2nd by Randle. Roll Call: RANDLE—AYE; PILGRIM—AYE; WHALEY—AYE; SHECKLER—AYE; KINGSLEY—AYE. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion to pay bills made by Pilgrim, 2nd by Randle. Roll Call: RANDLE—AYE; PILGRIM—AYE; WHALEY—AYE; SHECKLER—AYE; KINGSLEY—AYE. All ayes, motion carried.

Jason Cohee expressed his concern about having a K-9 unit in Police Department. Discussion followed.

Michele Knott and Darell Tucker questioned Board why police was sent to apartments at Walnut and Essex Streets. Discussion followed.

Rick Shurts informed Board that he has authority from the executor of the Ruth Shurts Estate to begin repairs on property at 608 S. Glasford Road and requested from the Board an extension to get necessary repairs done to secure the property. Discussion followed. Mr. Shurts was granted until September 17, 2020 to get house and foundation repairs done to secure premises and to keep premises free of weeds in order to avoid any other legal proceedings.


