

**VILLAGE OF GLASFORD**  
**BOARD MEETING MINUTES – MARCH 17, 2022**

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Village Board of Glasford was convened at 7:00pm. In attendance were Mayor Rudd, Clerk/Treasurer Stetler, Trustees Allen, Randle, Arnold, Sheckler and Kingsley. Trustee Godby and Supt. Reimer were absent. Also in attendance were Chief Beachler; Eric Shangraw; John and Nanette Rudd.

**RECOGNITION OF VISITORS**

APPROVAL of Feb. 17, 2022 board meeting minutes, made by Kingsley, 2nd by Sheckler. Roll call: ALLEN—AYE; RANDLE—AYE; ARNOLD —AYE; GODBY—ABSENT; KINGSLEY—AYE; SHECKLER—AYE. All ayes, motion carried.

Eric Shangraw of GFL Environmental (formerly PDC/Area) presented proposed contract for residential garbage to begin July 1, 2022. Discussion followed. Under new contract, residents would receive 1 free 96-gallon tote; rate to increase to \$15/customer; GFL would provide bins for electronic recycling; option to rent additional totes at the rate of \$3.50/month; and some previous miscellaneous terms would still apply.

Motion to enter into new contract with GFL Environmental (formerly PDC/Area) beginning July 1, 2022, made by Allen, 2nd by Sheckler. Roll call: ALLEN—AYE; RANDLE—AYE; ARNOLD —AYE; GODBY—ABSENT; KINGSLEY—AYE; SHECKLER—AYE. All ayes, motion carried.

John and Nanette Rudd informed the Board that they were working with the Glasford Optimist Club on possibly having the Annual Optimist Club Community Sale in May 2022. Discussion followed. Board agreed to usage of Tiger Bluffs Park for the sale and Rudds' to report back with a date, if they are able to get everything lined up for the sale.

Nanette Rudd informed Board that Whitetails is sponsoring two (2) different events this summer for St. Judes. First date being May 19, 2022 and second being June 30, 2022. Discussion followed. Board approved dates.

Nanette Rudd informed Board that the annual Cruise-In would be held July 31, 2022. Discussion followed. Board approved the date.

John Rudd requested of the Board if possible, to get the west side of Whitetails parking lot sealcoated being that it is Village property. Discussion followed.

Chief Beachler discussed National Night Out on August 2, 2022. This is an annual community-building campaign that promotes strong police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live and work. Discussion followed. Board agreed upon having this program.
